ACCESSIBILITY OF FINANCIAL SERVICES FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

Dear Partners and Collaborators,

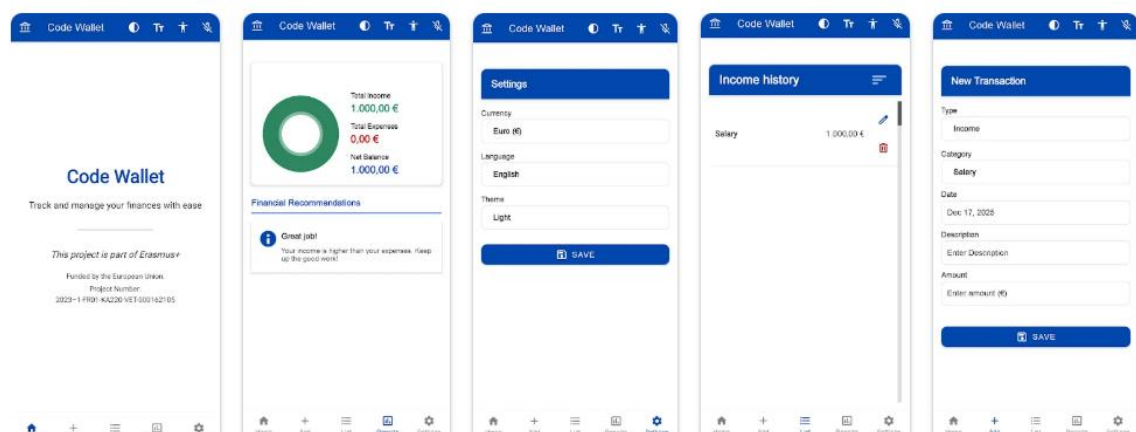
We are excited to present you the latest updates on the CODE project – a collaborative initiative to promote the inclusion of persons with disabilities in the banking and finance sectors.

As the CODE project moves forward, April marks an important milestone with the finalization of one of its key digital tools: the Code Wallet application.

Developed through close collaboration between partners and with a constant focus on accessibility, the Code Wallet is designed to support users in applying and managing the knowledge acquired throughout the project. Particular attention has been given to usability, clarity, and inclusiveness, ensuring that the application can be easily used by people with different types of disabilities.

With the development phase now coming to an end, the project is entering a crucial stage: user testing. This phase places people with disabilities at the heart of the process, giving them the opportunity to directly interact with the application in real-life conditions. Their experience is essential to validate the relevance and accessibility of the tool.

To collect structured and meaningful feedback, participants are invited to complete a questionnaire focusing on key aspects such as ease of navigation, understanding of content, accessibility features, and overall user experience. This feedback will allow the partnership to identify areas for improvement and make final adjustments before the official release of the application.





At the same time, partners are already looking ahead to the final stage of the project, which will take place in Italy on September 2026. This upcoming meeting will be dedicated to the testing and finalization of the CODE training platform, bringing together partners and users to validate the tools developed throughout the project.

This event will represent a key moment to consolidate results, share final feedback, and ensure that the platform is fully operational, accessible, and ready for wider dissemination. It will also provide an opportunity to reflect on the project's achievements and prepare the next steps towards sustainability and long-term impact.

As we approach the conclusion of the CODE project, the focus remains on delivering practical, inclusive, and high-quality tools that contribute to improving access to financial services for persons with disabilities.
